During the summer project in 2021, we engaged a group of very high support young women on a weekly basis, we have worked with these young people for a number of years but this piece of work was very special as we probably knew this would be the last summer these young women would engage with us on a weekly/consistent basis, they got to enjoy experiences and memories, they probably wouldn't have had otherwise. These young people still engage but far more sporadically, however their relationship with the service over the years has encouraged them to know they can still come to us when they need support or in times of crisis.

Last March 2021 we engaged a group of 10 young people aged 14+ and Youth work staff in a charity fundraising challenge. The fundraising campaign the young people were running was a challenge consisting of participants running, jogging or walking 203 km (the equivalent of following the county border of Dublin all the way round) over the 31 days in March. This was a challenge to support the physical and mental wellbeing of young people that are taking part in a period in which has been impacted by the Covid 19 pandemic and the restrictions in which accompanied it.

The fundraiser was for the "Hear me out" Youth counselling project and as a result of the young people completing this challenge they managed to raise €3000. This money has not only contributed to young people in the community having additional opportunities to engage in the counselling service but it has also provided a greater level of awareness of the "Hear me Out" Youth counselling service and this has made a real positive contribution to young people of whom have and need to access it.

THE TRAVELLER YOUTH PROJECT

The TYP started in September 2021 as a Saturday pilot programme to reengage young travellers from all sites in the area, we increased traveller engagement by 52 young people reaching young people and family's from 2/3 of sites and establishing engagement with new young people and family's previously not engages in the service, we also engaged a junior group from Avilla who are children of young people from the first Traveller project, making this our first intergenerational project.

The project is very positive and has already engaged young people in a Traveller awareness project and culminated in a residential enjoyed by 10 young Travellers. This was hugely enjoyed by young people and staff alike

The Junior leaders Group

This group began in September 2021, young people who need support to build their confidence were identified by staff and asked to join a leadership programme, the programme has focused on knowledge, how groups work. young people getting to know new things through research and experiential learning, they now have knowledge they did not have before. Skills based learning where young people learned through experience, new skills such as team games and street games and how to work together, young people are currently taking part in First Aid skills. Also, the development of personal qualities such as equality, acceptance, and support for each other. Young people are developing their social skills on a continuing basis and are preparing to run community programmes in the summer.
